DINING FACILITY SOON TO BE PAID OFF!

It took less than four years - Chosen 300's Dining Facility for the homeless of Center City Philadelphia will soon be paid in full! Funds raised in this year's First Annual Walk Against Homelessness were instrumental in reaching this goal.

The Dining Facility is the 1^{st} tier of a planned 3-Tier Transitional Center serving over 60,000 meals each year to Philadelphia's homeless. The second and third tiers will include facilities for training and temporary transitional housing.



A presentation of the final payment on the Dining Facility will be made on June 3rd, during the 11th Annual Session of the Chosen 300 Alliance of Churches. Chosen 300 Ministries congratulates Dexter Scott, who was licensed into ministry on April 4, 2007.

Dexter has been a faithful servant and a tremendous asset to Chosen 300, having served for over seven years in a number of positions of increasing responsibility.

Dexter began serving with his local congregation, Salem Baptist Church, which serves on the 4th Saturday of each month. In 2004, Dexter was appointed as the Saturday Homeless Outreach Manager and

in January 2006, he joined the staff of Chosen 300.

In addition to continuing to lead the Saturday teams, Dexter also leads the new congregants class, which teaches basic principles of salvation, baptism, the Lord's supper and the right hand of fellowship. Finally, Dexter manages the Sunday morning breakfast program.

CHOSEN 300TM IN GUYANA

In Guyana, South America 75% of the population lives below the Guyanese poverty level, earning less than \$1,800 U.S. dollars each year. A lack of jobs and resources often leave families suffering without adequate food, shelter, clothing and health care.

Guyana Food Distribution

Established in October 2006 by Chosen 300 Ministries, the Guyana Food Distribution now distributes over 2,500 pounds of food each month to needy families in the Timehri District of Georgetown, Guyana, South America. Some of the food distributed includes rice, flour, dry milk and peas.

The food distribution program is the outgrowth of Executive Director Brian Jenkins' visit to Guyana with the Lott Carey Foreign Mission Pastoral Excellence Program. Moved by the extreme poverty, upon his

return a partnership was formed with Elim Timehri Christian Fellowship to help change lives in the country.

Further, as part of Chosen 300's commitment to providing humanitarian relief around the world, additional Mission Emersion trips are planned to Jamaica, West Indes in October 2007 and to Zimbabwe, Africa in October 2008.
