Impact of Economic Downturn

The result of an economy in a downward spiral is the increased need for services provided by organizations like Chosen 300. Sadly, the number of homeless increases and families who were at one time self-sufficient find themselves needing help.



At the same time many corporations who are a significant source of funding for the ministry are tightening their belts as well. The

unfortunate result has been a shortfall in funding at the very time when needs are increasing.

In spite of these challenges, Chosen 300 remains faithful to its mission and has continued to expand services. A second feeding center was opened in West Philadelphia to meet the needs of low income families. Strategic management decisions such as reducing operational costs and using volunteer resources wherever possible help make this growth possible during these difficult times. In addition, for two years Chosen 300 staff have deferred salary increases. According to Brian Jenkins, Executive Director, "It wouldn't be right for our staff to receive a pay increase when others throughout the region and across the country are suffering with job losses and pay cuts."

Capital Campaign

Approximately \$160,000 was raised toward building the Training Center, recognized as Tier 2 of the 3-Tiered Capital Campaign. It is because of funding shortfalls that the goal of raising the full amount of \$250,000 by year end 2008 was not met.

Food Program

There are now 44 churches that form the Chosen 300 Alliance. Together they serve over 80,000 hot meals to Philadelphia's homeless and poor each year. Despite the difficult economic times, six new churches joined the Alliance during 2008:

Ministry Around The World - Port Elizabeth, South Africa



In October, Brian Jenkins, Executive Director, traveled to Port Elizabeth, South Africa. There he worked alongside local pastors, learning about their culture and the community's needs while exploring possibilities to expand the mission of Chosen 300 around the world.

Children searching for food at trash dump

One life-changing moment provided Brian the direction he was seeking. When he saw a young boy the age of his own sons at a garbage dump,

digging for a discarded juice bottle and devouring the precious few drops of juice that remained inside, he knew lives would be changed by providing food in South Africa. A food program is set to kick off in January 2009, providing rice, flour, peas and crushed corn to local families.



When asked why Chosen 300 is helping people overseas when there are needy people in the United States, Brian refers to Acts 1:8. "The Bible says we are to be witnesses BOTH in Jerusalem AND in Judea AND Samaria AND the uttermost parts of the world. That means we are to meet the needs of the poor here in the United States AND help our


